- Our Aftercare Students participated in "Monster Artwork" featured in The Young Artists Monster Madness publication





#### MATH DEPARTMENT


- St. Augustine School offers a rigorous mathematics curriculum that aligns with the Common Core State Standards for Mathematics. Students develop a deep conceptual understanding by using mathematics manipulatives to foster learning, then using the knowledge gained to progress to more abstract concepts. Skills build from one grade level to the next so that students can acquire mastery. Multiple strategies are modeled to promote conceptual understanding, procedural fluency, and problem-solving skills.
- Kindergarten-5th grade uses the McGraw Hill Reveal Mathematics program. This program focuses on metacognition, problem solving, engagement, flexibility, and productive interactions. STEM and SEL are integrated throughout each unit.
- Middle school students utilize the Big Ideas Math (Common Core 2014) program. Each grade level has a traditional and accelerated class, providing support and enrichment for all students in classrooms with a 14:1 student/teacher ratio.
- NWEA MAP Mathematics Assessments are administered to students in grades 2-8 in the Fall, Winter, and Spring. Teachers use the results to monitor growth and guide instruction to meet the needs of all students.
- 7th-8th grade girls had the opportunity to participate in the Math Olympiad at The Catholic High School. Our 8th grade boys had the opportunity to participate in a MathCounts competition in February at Clarksville Middle School
- After School student-led Math tutoring program implemented to support students in grades 3 to 5



#### STEM DEPARTMENT

- Utilizes the Archdiocese of Baltimore's Science Curriculum as well as Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS)
- Mystery Science used in grades 3 5
- PreK Middle School incorporate individual STEM challenges and innovative learning opportunities

#### ELA DEPARTMENT

- St. Augustine School utilizes the Archdiocese of Baltimore Curriculum as well as the *SuperKids* Reading Series in grades K-5 and *CommonLit* in grades 6-8.
- Besides our core curriculum, grades 3-8 read and analyze novels, such as *Number the Stars, The Lion, The Witch, and the Wardrobe, Fever 1793, Romeo & Juliet,* and *Macbeth*.
- Student progress is monitored through both formative and summative classroom assessments as well as using data gathered from the NWEA MAP Assessment.
- Students in need of extra support meet with the Reading Specialist.
- Extras
  - Scripps National Spelling Bee All students from K to 8 can participate in the SAS Spelling Bee and the winner goes on to the Howard County Spelling Bee
  - 2nd to 4th Grade Book Club Students read a book assigned by the team and meet once a month. At the meeting, the students discuss the book and respond orally to guided questions provided by the moderator.

### SOCIAL STUDIES DEPARTMENT

- St. Augustine School follows the Archdiocese of Baltimore's curriculum and standards for Social Studies.
- Simulations and role plays in the classroom bring the content to life:
  - Fifth grade completed a colonial simulation where students take on roles, create a town, and discuss the different aspects of life that would make the town successful (food, jobs, religion, culture, etc.).
  - 4th and 5th grades visited Historic St. Mary's City
  - 3rd and 4th graders completed a Market Project during their economics unit, creating a marketing strategy to sell their goods (bracelets, pictures, t-shirts, etc.)
- Celebrating national holidays and discussing their importance
- Researching current events and presenting them to the class in the format of a newscast
- National History Day 7th and 8th graders presented projects related to this year's theme "Rights and Responsibilities"







#### RELIGION DEPARTMENT

- Our faith plays an integral role in everything we do here at St. Augustine Catholic School.
- All students utilize the Sadlier Religion Series during daily religion classes. Intermediate
  grades incorporate bible study and scripture reading, while Middle School focuses on the
  Saints of the Catholic Church and engage in a weekly Lectio Divina.
- Students attend and actively participate in weekly Mass, and seasonal observances including Advent prayer services, Stations of the Cross, and recitation of the Rosary in October and May.
- Students also have the opportunity to receive the sacrament of Reconciliation during the Advent and Lenten seasons.
- The second grade class leads a May procession with a May Crowning by our Student Council Religious Coordinator.
- Our students truly shine a light for all to see as they actively model being disciples of Christ.





## EARLY CHILDHOOD DEPARTMENT

Our early childhood department is both MSDE Accredited and continues to meet the MSDE Maryland Excels Level 5 rating.

This is the highest rating possible through Maryland Excels and MSDE for preschool and before/after care programs. We are so proud of our PK program.

#### SPECIALS DEPARTMENT

St. Augustine offers a wide array of special content area classes including art, music, physical education, technology, and Spanish.

- Our art and music classes allow our students to demonstrate their creativity while incorporating standards from multiple core content areas. Religion is continuously integrated into each curriculum.
- Physical education has provided our students with the opportunity to engage in physical activity while promoting good sportsmanship and kind interactions with classmates.
- Students learn to navigate technology with the use of Chromebooks, gaining essential experience that will prepare them for future discoveries and advancements.
- We are blessed to have our partnership with 'The Language Project' as our students are exposed to the Spanish language beginning in Kindergarten. K to 5th grade receive Spanish instruction once per week, while the middle school has Spanish classes twice per week in preparation for high school.
- After school, we offer our Broadway Kids Theater Program to students in grades 5-8. The students performed Seussical, Jr. in March!



#### **ADMISSIONS**

We welcomed over 50 new students for the 2024-2025 school year and are currently preparing for the 2025-2026 school year.

This November, our Veterans Day open house hosted over 30 prospective families throughout the school day. Our Catholic Schools Week open house was a success as we welcomed over 35 families. A true testament to our wonderful school! Mr. Miller and Mrs. Kaplan welcomed families and Student Ambassadors along with HSA Members were able to give tours. We also had our band members perform at the open house. Parent volunteers were also on hand to help with set up, tours, and clean up. Our community is amazing!

The Admissions season is in full swing! Preschool, 1st Grade, 2nd Grade, and middle school classes all have waiting lists for the 2025-2026 school year. #### ANNUAL ASBESTOS STATEMENT

Inspections and sampling have been performed by Aerosol Monitoring and Analysis, Inc. of Maryland. An Operations and Maintenance Program has been i9mplemented to maintain these materials in good condition, as well as prevent disturbance or damage. The AHERA Management Plan for Saint Augustine Catholic School is available in the school office for review.

#### Playground Expansion Project



Our goal is to expand the playground to include a structure similar to the picture above. In order to do so, current structures may need to be removed, relocated, or even the playground itself needs to be expanded. We have been working with our playground representative to provide insight into structures that would fit our budget and timeframe. We will be using the funds set aside from the Race for Education to cover part of the cost, but will ultimately need to supplement these costs with money raised during our 2025 Annual Fund. Estimated total cost for this project is \$40,000+.
